Another program CNC is proud of is the Food Assistance program. Under the guidance of Holly and her team of volunteers, the weekly Foodbank delivery to the CNC has





With over 40 volunteers and family members assisting at the gardens or selling tickets at the Neighbourhood Centre hall, it is an event which could not happen without such huge community support. The Garden Club's Monster Plant sale was a great success with plants all grown by members and sold at very realistic prices which meant lots of bargains were quickly snapped up.

The Flower Show was held for the first time this year in the CNC hall alongside ticket sales for the CGLW. This resulted in many more people viewing beautiful plants and creatively presented vases of flowers. The orchids were splendid! Thirty-one people put entries in various sections and the committee would like to see this number grow next year. Most entries in the Floral Art, both Novice and

Advanced sections were well represented. Mr Greg Block judged the Floral Art with Club President Pam Lockhart, taking out the Gold Ribbon for Champion exhibit in Floral Art.

The Creswick Flowers Posy Challenge was another popular section that was judged by Simone Broad. The Adult 1st prize of a \$30 voucher went to Evelyn Wilson while the Junior 1st prize of a \$20 voucher was won by Matilda Martin.

Meals on Wheels Volunteer Spotlight: Brian and Josie Reasons

Brian and Josie Reasons have been delivering Meals on Wheels to the Creswick community for the last five years and say it's an incredibly rewarding way to spend their days. Now in their eighties, the husband and wife duo travel together two to three times a week to deliver nutritious meals and provide valuable social connections to people within their community. Some days, the Reasons visit more than twenty people in the area starting in Creswick but going out as far as Smeaton.

Driven by a desire to give back, the Reasons have found their visits to be more than just a task - they've become trips to see their friends and cherished moments filled with connection and purpose.

Josie shares that each visit brightens her day just as much as it does for the people she sees. 'It's not just

about delivering food; it's about making sure the people in our town feel that people are looking out for them. They're always happy when you walk in - sometimes we'll be the only people they speak to that day. The smiles on their faces are just amazing and extremely rewarding.' Brian recalls moments where the impact of their service is evident. 'We've met so many lovely people who just need a friendly face and a bit of help. And it's not always just delivering the meals and having a chat – we've helped in all sorts of ways. Some people need help with reading their



mail or getting it from the mailbox and others have asked us to help with some tailoring of their clothes. We're always happy to help in any way we can. And we're not giving them a handout, we're give them a hand up.'

The Creswick Meals on Wheels program is currently seeking volunteers to help keep the program strong. If you're looking to make a meaningful difference, consider joining this vital service. As Brian and Josie's story shows, the rewards of volunteering extend far beyond the meals you deliver.

Brian adds 'If you're at all curious about helping, pick up the phone and give it a try because I think you'll be hooked. I would say nine out of ten people have enjoyed it once they gave it a go and you won't know until you try. It's only a few hours a week and the rewards

are worth it'.



IMPROVING OUR ROADS



The arrival of better weather means more opportunity to improve our roads. Council is commencing its road reseal program by stabilising patching on selected roads. As part of our \$450,000 contract awarded in September, our contractor has begun work in Creswick. Stabilised patching helps enhance road pavements using cement or other additives. We will also be resealing selected roads over the summer period to improve them. Our patching program

will focus on preparing roads for resealing before we tackle other areas in the Shire. Our works teams have been busy repairing pavements, especially around West Berry Road in Allendale. If you are travelling on our roads and you see the road reseal teams, please keep them safe by following all traffic signs.

HONOUR ROLL INDUCTEE

Raymond (Ray) James Laycock 1931 - 2021

For His Contribution to Creswick Bowling Club as a Player, Administrator and Organiser

Ray Laycock was born in Beechworth on 27 August 1931. His parents were Ernest James Pierce Laycock (1902-1960) and Sara Keighrey (1902-1958). He had three brothers: Ernest Keith Laycock (1930-2011), Leonard Laycock (1933-1933) and Noel Francis Laycock (1935-1970).

His early schooling was at Beechworth. From the age of nine he worked at the local newsagency as a delivery boy as well as working on the delivery van during the school holidays. At the age of 15, he began an apprenticeship (1947-1954) as a cabinet maker in Melbourne. He then worked at the Victorian Railway Workshop in Ballarat

Ray married Dalys Joy Torney, known as Billee, (1929-2007) on 13 November, 1954 in the Creswick Methodist

Church. They had two children: Robyn Ann Laycock (Oswin) in 1955 and Ross Gregory Laycock in 1957.

Ray and Billee built their home at 51 Clunes Road, Creswick. In 1978 they purchased and ran the mixed business shop in Creswick North for eight years.

The first bowling green in Creswick was opened in 1876 at Leopold Park, later known as Hammon Park. In 1932, the green was moved to a site near the corner of Albert and Victoria Streets. The last move was from there to Lindsay Park in 2014.

Ray Laycock joined the Creswick Bowling Club in 1956 at the age of

25. At that time, he was the youngest player ever to have played with Creswick. This was the start of 60 years of service to the club in many roles and the start of a championship career that not only brought honour to Creswick and the bowling club, but also to the Victorian, Australian and International bowling scene.

In 1958, he became a member of the bowling club's committee. This was at a time of great growth at the bowling club in Albert Street. A new green was built on the site of the tennis court adjoining the existing green. The tennis court had been moved to Cushing Avenue. Construction of the green was done by members of the bowling club over two years and it was opened for play in 1959. One of the two greens was considered to be one of the best in the Association.

Ray was Works Manager for several years and oversaw the renovations and extensions to the club house. He organised working bees and maintained the buildings and surrounds. His organisational and administrative skills

extended to most major events at Club level, both socially and competitively.

In 1962, a new kitchen was built in the club house by Fred Hepworth. Ray, being a cabinet maker, assisted Fred as well as organising the working bees, some 18 in number. The old wooden green shelters were replaced by new ones. In 1965, a new and separate men's toilet was added. Then a sand shelter on a concrete slab.

To finish the club house, new collapsible tables were produced at Bill Mizzeni's farm using tubular steel. Bill was assisted in this project by Ray and others.

His organisational and administrative skills were also used to organise competitions, fund raising and social events, including the Annual Dinner.


> Ray was a selector from 1960 until 2003; a committee member from 1958 until 2005; Club President 1967-1968; Green Caretaker from 1987; then progressively assumed the role of Greenkeeper until 1996. This involved mowing up to three times weekly, rolling the greens, watering and all the other aspects of maintaining high-class grass greens.

> He was also coach for Creswick teams, the Smeaton Ladies and Mens Indoor Bowls Secretary/ Treasurer 1982-1995.

One story about Ray is the tale of the donated piano. The club was

gifted a piano by the local chemist, Mr Ken Barrell. Transporting it through the main street to the club house, it fell off the trailer right in front of the chemist shop! Not to be defeated, Ray painstakingly repaired the cabinetry while his wife, Billee, a gifted pianist, repaired the keys and other working parts. It then

Ray achieved many bowling successes. These are just a few of them:



continued its journey to the club house.

Ray played at State level starting in 1969. In 2001, a Creswick District News article stated that he had played 192 state games over 20 years. During that time he was a State Selector and State Coach.

He represented Australia at the Edinburgh Commonwealth Games in 1986.

HONOUR ROLL INDUCTEE Raymond (Ray) James Laycock 1931 – 2021

In 1985, the Creswick Bowling Club conferred Life Membership on Ray, recognising his long membership on the committee since 1958; selector since 1960; his two years of Presidency; many years of service as Works Manager, including several years of renovations and extensions to the club house and a term as Greenkeeper. His administrative skills extended to organising most major events at club level, both socially and competitively.

In his honour, a green at the Albert Street site was named the *Ray Laycock Green* which recorded, 'the passionate dedication of an outstanding sportsman and administrator'.

Nationally Ray was honoured with the presentation of the Australian Sports Medal and in 2000 the Royal Victorian Bowls Association's *Medal of Merit*. He was Creswick's Sportsman of the Year five times.

Ray played bowls until he was in his 80s. He died on 26 December, 2021, aged 90.

Hollinwood – The sale of property at Hollinwood on Wednesday last, conducted by Messrs John T. Sloan and Co., auctioneers, on behalf of the trustee of the estate of John Hawkins, proved successful. The competition was very keen, and the property was eventually purchased by Mr. Joseph Sanders, who intends to establish his home on the property at an early date.

December 5, 1924

The plant, land, buildings, stock, etc., of the Creswick Brick, Tile and Potteries Ltd. (in liquidation) at North Creswick, were sold by public auction yesterday. The whole was sold in one lot. Bidding started at £2,000 and when £2,310 had been reached, was knocked down to Mr. M. T. Batkin, formerly managing director of the company. We understand Mr. Batkin acted for a party, who intend carrying on operations.

December 9, 1924

Kingston – The Red and Black Entertainers will give an entertainment in the Kingston Mechanics' hall this (Tuesday) evening, when the proceeds will be in aid of the school funds and an injured footballer. The prices of tickets are 1/6 and 1/-. A dance will follow, for which the gentlemen will pay 1/6 and ladies provide refreshments.

December 12, 1924

The opening ceremony of the Dean Higher Elementary School was carried out on Thursday, 4th inst., under most favorable weather conditions. The widespread interest in the school and the occasion was evinced by the throng of people who filled the new assembly hall to overflowing.

December 16, 1924

St. John's Tennis Court. Opening on Saturday, 20th December, at 3.30 p.m. Members of the Congregation and Public generally invited. F. Mann, Hon. Sec.

December 19, 1924

At the recent examination for the certificate of the Royal Victorian Trained Nurses' Association, the Misses Mavis M. Moroney and Sadie McKay passed. These young ladies trained in the Creswick District Hospital and can be congratulated on their success.

December 23, 1924

That well established organisation, the Springmount Sports Club, will hold its annual races and sports in Mr. Hackett's paddock on Christmas Day — Thursday next. In past years some very pleasant and enjoyable gatherings have taken place at Springmount, and Thursday's event should be no exception to the rule. The programme is of a diversified character, consisting of horse races, various kinds of athletic events and dancing for the juveniles. An addition has been made to the programme, an event for buggy horses being included.

December 30, 1924

The Creswick Victory Brass Band, under the leadership of Mr. Herb Vague, had a very busy time during the Christmas holidays. On Christmas Eve the band played in several parts of the town; on Christmas Day they played at the Springmount Sports; on Boxing Day at the Talbot sports; and on Saturday at the Allendale Sports. On each occasion they acquitted themselves well.
