performing for the winter season at the Longreach Hall Fame and promises to entertain young and old. The show will also welcome chain saw wood sculptor Dean Smith the Dancing Bear. Dean is a Melbourne/

Ballarat based practising sculptor/ performer who loves to indulge in many forms of art and has worldwide

experience. His grounding inspiration comes from his life experience and the connection with animals and the earth. As always, there will be live music on the stage throughout the day. Much loved local solo performer **Troy Elliott** will take to the stage at around 3.45pm for a couple of hours and during his performance the chainsaw sculptures will be auctioned. This promises to be a highlight on both fronts.

Last year we welcomed the **Western Wolves-Ballarat Medieval Combat** team for the first time and they return this year. This is really something to see and not for the faint hearted. Their shows run hourly.

Animals are always a huge part of any country show and Clunes is no exception. The Big Ones, Tall Ones, Small Ones and Really Tiny and Slimy Fun Pet Show, is always a hit bring along anything other than a horse, for the judging at 1.00pm. There's also Wicked Wildlife, pony rides and ferret

racing throughout the day. Not to mention the livestock competitions and judging which are such a key element to any country show.

The **Dog High Jump** competition is an annual crowd favourite. That's at 2.00pm so don't miss that, or the ladies woodsplit, gumboot throw, keg throw and tug of war, throughout the afternoon. All great spectacles and

good for a laugh while you enjoy a quiet drink at the bar.

The **Bute Ute competition** has been a much loved feature of the show for years. Bring yours and try your luck. Entries will be taken until 11.30am on show day. The kids will love the giant sandpit, carnival rides, face painting, puppets and showbags. The **Homecrafts Pavilion** will be filled with home cookery,



floral displays, art, photography and a whole lot more. A full horse program will occupy the main arena throughout the day.

Ullina Landcare Group News

CRESWICK HAVILAH LODGE



The September meeting of the Lodge featured a special event, the bringing out of one of the Lodge's artistic treasures, a Harris Tracing Board. These boards date from the 1840s and were purchased by the Lodge very early in its history, in 1862.

In the days of Operative Masons, building the cathedrals of the Middle Ages, the Master Masons used sand tables to draw out their designs and plans for the workmen to follow. In Speculative Masonry, the modern-day Freemasons, the practice of using symbols to illustrate its teachings by drawings, usually by using chalk on the floor, was re-introduced in the mid 1700s. The drawings were then erased at the end of the meeting. This practice was, in time, refined by using canvases which could be rolled up and stored away, later paintings were hung on the walls and covered between meetings. But there was no standardization of these illustrations until the English Lodge of Improvement sponsored Emulation competition in 1845 to come up with a standard version. English artist John Harris won that competition. He refined the design in 1849, and this design is now used throughout the English-speaking world. Creswick Havilah has a set of these 1849 boards, produced by John Harris himself.

The boards were the original set of Tracing Boards used by the Lodge, but they are small and were replaced late in the 1800s by the larger set still in use today.

The Harris Boards were lost for many years but were rediscovered in 1986 in the roof space above the foyer. They were subsequently re-framed and mounted on the southwest wall of the Lodge by the late Harry Barclay and are opened on special occasions. The September meeting was one such special occasion, as several newer members of this and other nearby Lodges listened to an explanation of the symbolism and teachings embodied in the First-Degree Harris Tracing Board. The board was set up on a chair before them so they could better see it, in all its exquisite detail.

The explanation was eloquently and professionally delivered by Very Worshipful Brother Eddie Koene. Many members of the Creswick community would know Bro Eddie from his time as publican at the Farmers Arms and, with his family, the provider of the ANZAC Day Gunfire Breakfast over recent years. The Lodge thanks Bro Eddie for the obvious considerable work he put into the presentation.

October, 21 1924

On Thursday last, a surprise visit was paid to the local school by Mr. W. W. Gay, Supervisor of Forestry. After carefully inspecting the seed plot in the school ground, Mr. Gay visited the school plantation, and expressed himself delighted with the sturdy, well cared for trees, and also with the work done in the area. He was amazed to note that many of the trees had made the growth of six inches, and said that the loss of only five trees out of 685 planted constituted a record.

October, 24 1924

On Thursday afternoon, the 30th inst., the Creswick State School pavilions will be opened by the Mayor (Mr. T. Cushing). These pavilions were erected by the school committee, the cost being defrayed equally by the Education department and the committee.

October, 28 1924

Intending exhibitors at the annual show of the Kingston, Smeaton, Newlyn and Dean Agricultural and Pastoral Society, to be held on Saturday, 8th November, are reminded that entries close on Thursday next, 30th inst., with the secretary Mr. G. C. Morrish of Kingston.


